

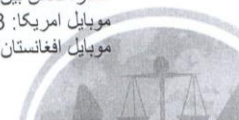

Investigation confirms police actions

Disciplinary steps urged against officers

Disciplinary action could be taken in a few days against third shift police officers and supervisors involved in racist and sexist behavior, Wauwatosa officials announced this week.

Mayor James Brundahl called for disciplinary measures Tuesday after an internal police investigation verified several allegations made by third shift police clerk John Kutz. Brundahl said the most serious allegations the city was able to corroborate were that officers held mock Martin Luther King Day parties with racist themes in 1988 and 1989 and the firing of a gun with blanks last year at Kutz, a civilian employee who was on duty.

The allegations complicate the city's search for a new police chief because both Acting Police Chief Frederick J. Basting and third shift commander, Lt. James Zalewski, are among the eight finalists for the position. City officials have decided to

proceed with the interview process, which will continue today and Friday.

Although the investigation uncovered no criminal behavior, Brundahl said the allegations have sullied Wauwatosa's image. He said to help prevent a recurrence of such behavior, the city would implement a comprehensive human relations training program and accelerate efforts to recruit minority police officers. The police department has no black police officers among its 110 employees and less than one percent of the city's population is black.

"This is an embarrassment to the city," Brundahl said Tuesday after aldermen met in executive session for about 90 minutes. "We don't condone any of the kinds of activities we see here."

The investigation, conducted by the Police Department, the city, and the Milwaukee law firm Quarles and Brady, has confirmed that off-duty Martin Luther King Day parties were held without the knowledge of the police chief or city officials in January of 1988 and 1989 at the home of a police sergeant. The parties were attended by 12 Police Department employees, 11 of whom were assigned to the third shift.

Ethnic food was served, including grits, fried chicken and watermelon, and at one of the parties an officer wore a mask depicting himself as a black man, Brundahl said. Party goers wore name-tags bearing the names of minority persons, the mayor said.

The department was unable to verify whether Klu Klux Klan materials or Confederate flags were displayed at the parties, as Kutz alleged. Sexually explicit movies were shown at the parties, but there is no proof, nor were there allegations, that pornography or other illegal materials were used, Brundahl said.

Brundahl emphasized that the off-duty activities involved a small group of Police

1 Racism charges hit Police Dept. shaking up city

Charges that were levied against 13 police officers accused of racist or demeaning behavior in March because of their involvement in two Martin Luther King Day theme parties in 1988 and 1989 were dismissed in November by the Wauwatosa Police and Fire Commission.

A March investigation revealed the officers allegedly attended two parties in the home of Sgt. John Bozicevich where ethnic foods were served, an officer allegedly wore a black mask and officers wore name tags bearing the names of minority persons.

Many community members, including several Common Council members and Mayor James Brundahl were publicly outraged at the officers' behavior. In an

attempt to improve the city's public image and correct any racist behavior by city personnel, the Common Council tried to get funding for a human relations program for all city employees but the measure was not approved.

The charges against the officers were later dismissed by the Police and Fire Commission. The commission ruled the issues pertaining to off-duty activities of police officers involve important constitutional issues in which the rights of police departments and communities must be balanced with the rights and duties of individual police officers.

The Police and Fire Commission will determine in January the fate of officers

who engaged in pranks while on-duty, including one incident in which a gun was allegedly pointed at a police clerk's head.

2 Hamburg center of controversy, ousted in Oct.

City Administrator Gary Hamburg, whose performance was under fire all year long, was fired by the Common Council in October.

Unhappy with his performance, the Council unsuccessfully tried in February

to relieve Hamburg of his duties. At that time he still had the support of eight of the 14 Council members.

Some Council members were upset at Hamburg because he approved the use of a squad car to transport an injured police department consultant back to his home in Chicago for treatment of the injury. His support was shortlived and practically nonexistent by the fall. Only four aldermen voted to let him keep his position.

An executive search team has been selected to find a new administrator. The PAR group from Chicago, the same firm used to fill the vacant police and fire chief positions, was hired this month.

Until the position is filled Mayor James

Police clerk's testimony charges harassment, fear

Wauwatosa Police clerk John Kutz said he was scared for his physical safety and feared the third-shift police officers, he testified before the Police and Fire Commission investigating on-duty conduct of some third-shift police officers.

Although he described himself as the department's "whipping boy," he kept the alleged incidents to himself out of fear, he said.

"They (the police officers) are all friends and I was one lone person by myself," Kutz said. "I had no union, nobody to go to. I feared retaliation."

Instead he remained silent and said he was the brunt of harassment, he claimed. Some of the antics were more than horseplay, he said. Kutz testified an officer fired a revolver at him, later to learn it was loaded with blanks; other officers threw lit firecrackers at him; and officers damaged his car when they moved it from the Police Department parking lot and decorated it with Christmas lights, signs and traffic cones, he testified.

Despite the antics he termed "harassing," Kutz continued to socialize with fellow third-shift workers because he said he was afraid to not participate in the parties.

"I attended the parties for fear of retaliation if I didn't go," Kutz said. The parties he attended included the two Martin Luther King parties, Christmas parties and a party at Long Lake.

Kutz cooperated with a departmental investigation led by then-Acting Chief Frederic Basting into the alleged 1988 and 1989 Martin Luther King Day parties. All charges related to the parties were dropped in November by the Police and Fire Commission because it ruled officers

have a constitutional right to privacy during off-duty time.

The investigation revealed some on-duty misconduct by officers Howard Bacon, David Breitlow, Lt. James Zalewski, Sgt. John Bozicevich and Mark Tebo and Det. Thomas Simon.

Another 20 to 24 hours of testimony is expected before the Police and Fire Commission renders a ruling on whether disciplinary actions against the officers should be upheld or dropped. The six police officers have yet to testify.

Attorney Linda Vanden Heuvel questioned why Kutz did not file his allegation charges immediately and directly to the Police Department hierarchy. She said it was obvious he understood the chain of command because he reported the Martin Luther King parties.

Kutz said he has additional harassment allegations against first-shift employees. He said his mail has not been given to him and he has had problems with fellow desk clerks and some other officers.

Even Police Chief Barry Weber is causing him problems, Kutz said. The chief asked him about his relationship with his attorney and questioned him if he was getting his money's worth, Kutz testified.

"I'm not welcome on the first shift and I'm an easy target," he said. He said he wants to work the third-shift and not the first-shift and filed a grievance against the city because he was assigned to the first shift.

Vanden Heuvel asked why these new allegations haven't been reported to Police Department supervisors. Kutz reported the charges to his attorneys, he said, because they are the only people he trusts.

THIS ANONYMOUS LETTER was reportedly sent to Wauwatosa police clerk John Kutz, who assisted city officials in the investigation into racist incidents within the department.

threats made against Kutz, Kern said.

One document brought forward by Kutz is an item titled "Official Runnin' Nigger Target." The single-page document depicts the silhouette of a running black man and a margin note reading, "Note: All body shots count. Shots to head do not count unless metal piercing cartridge is used." At the bottom right is a space for the "competitor's" name and score.

The second document is a notice from the "Department

state agency. Its initial page is typed on stationary containing the state seal.

The notice announces an open hunting season on "porch monkeys (unemployed Africans), regionally known as Jigaboos, Saucer Lips, Jungle Bunnies (jet black variety), Spooks, and Spear Chuckers."

It outlines regulations describing "game preserves," such as "welfare offices, food stamp distribution centers, liquor stores Cadillac dealerships, rib shops, ghettos, and sports arenas where

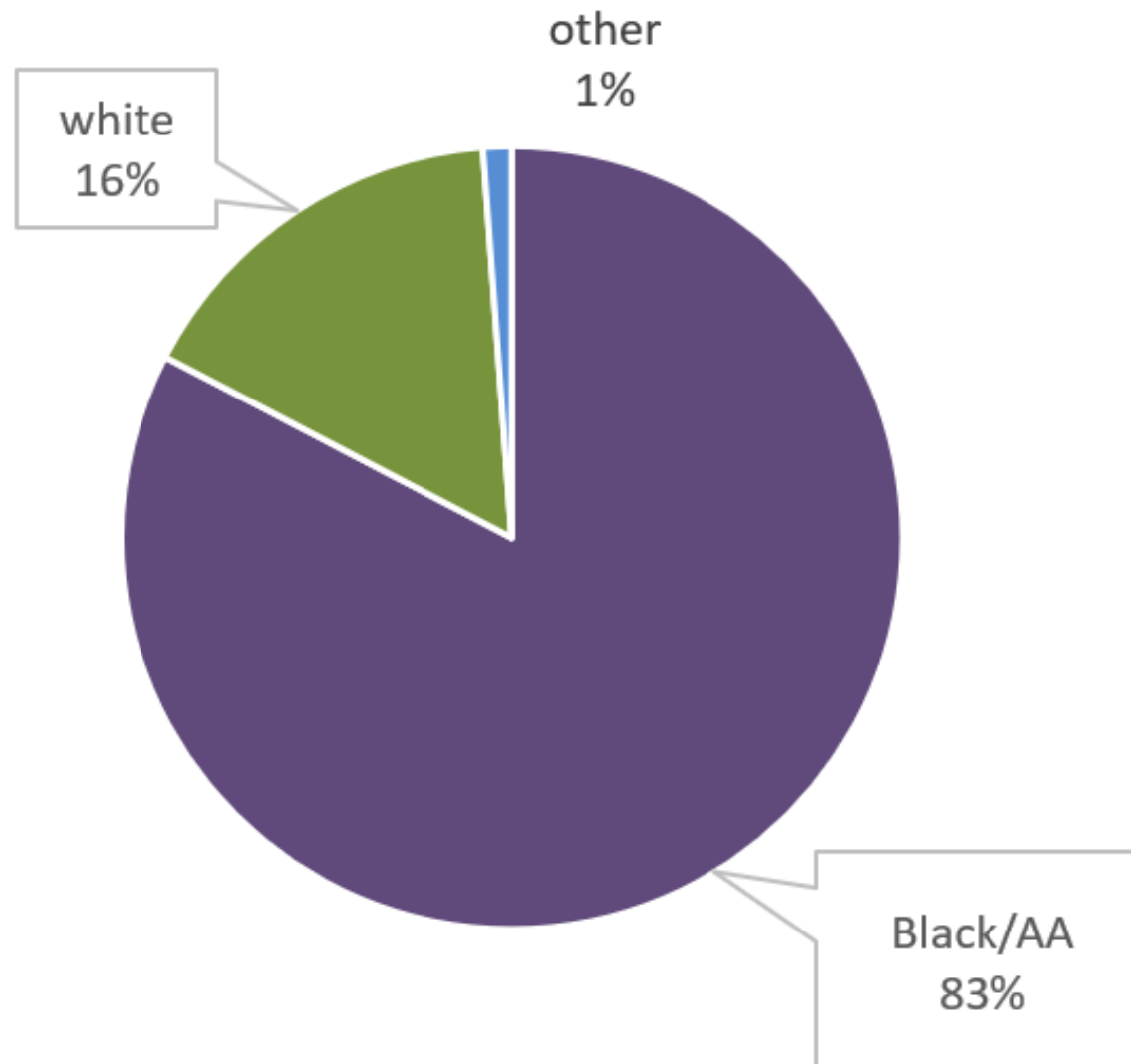

Wisconsin Stat., §968.02(3) states:
