THE BELOW NAMED COMPLAINANT BEING DULY SWORN, ON INFORMATION AND BELIEF STATES THAT:

Count 1: FLEE OR ELUDE AN OFFICER

The above-named defendant on or about Tuesday, October 26, 2021, at 5999 West Congress Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, while operating a motor vehicle on a highway, after having received a visual or audible signal from a traffic officer, federal law enforcement officer, or marked or unmarked police vehicle that the operator knew or reasonably should have known was being operated by a law enforcement officer, did knowingly flee or attempt to elude a traffic officer by increasing the speed of the vehicle in an attempt to flee, contrary to sec. 346.04(3), 939.50(3)(i) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class I Felony, the defendant may be fined not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), or imprisoned not more than three (3) years and six (6) months, or both.

And furthermore, invoking the provisions of Wisconsin Statute 343.31(3)(d)1, upon conviction the department shall revoke the defendant's operating privileges for 6 months.

And the defendant may also be subject to additional collateral consequences upon conviction, including revocation of operating privileges, assessment and treatment requirements, and future restrictions on operation of motor vehicles under Wisconsin Statute 343.31(1m).

Count 2: SECOND DEGREE RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING SAFETY

The above-named defendant on or about Tuesday, October 26, 2021, at 5999 West Congress Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, did recklessly endanger the safety of others, contrary to sec. 941.30(2), 939.50(3)(g) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class G Felony, the defendant may be fined not more than Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or imprisoned not more than ten (10) years, or both.

Count 3: RESISTING AN OFFICER

The above-named defendant on or about Tuesday, October 26, 2021, at 5999 West Congress Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, did knowingly resist an officer, while such

officer was doing an act in an official capacity and with lawful authority, contrary to sec. 946.41(1), 939.51(3)(a) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class A Misdemeanor, the defendant may be fined not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), or imprisoned not more than nine (9) months, or both.

Probable Cause:

Complainant is a City of Milwaukee Law Enforcement Officer and bases this complaint on information and belief and on a review of official police reports prepared by Milwaukee Police Officers which are the kind Complainant has used in the past and found to be truthful and reliable and which Complainant knows were prepared in the ordinary and regular course of business.

On October 26, 2021, at approximately 5:17 p.m., Officer Shaunade McIntosh and Officer Benjamin Bender were advised by Officer Schnell and Officer Ornelas that there were subjects inside a White Kia Sportage located in the Culvers parking lot located at 5501 W. Fond Du Lac Avenue, City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, that were wanted in connection with a shooting incident that occurred at Culvers a few days prior. Officer McIntosh and Officer Bender were both in full Milwaukee Police Department uniforms and were operating a fully marked squad car that was equipped with emergency lights and an audible siren.

Officer McIntosh observed the White Kia travelling at a high rate of speed driving erratically by navigating in and around traffic traveling westbound on W. Hampton Avenue. As the Kia passed Officer McIntosh's squad, Officer McIntosh observed the driver to be a black male, small/medium afro, wearing a dark colored hooded sweatshirt. Officer McIntosh conducted a u-turn to catch up to the Kia and the Kia conducted a u-turn and traveled at a high rate of speed traveling eastbound navigating in and around traffic. Officer McIntosh activated the emergency lights on their squad and audible siren to conduct a traffic stop on the Kia. The Kia led Officer McIntosh and Officer Bender on a high speed pursuit. Officer McIntosh observed the Kia traveling at speeds reaching up towards approximately 90 MPH. Officer McIntosh observed the Kia operate on a sidewalk and disregard a red traffic signal at the intersection of W. Fond Du Lac Avenue and N. 51st Blvd. Officer McIntosh observed the Kia traveling in and around traffic, disregard the traffic signal at W. Fond Du Lac Avenue and W. Roosevelt Dr., disregard a stop sign at N. 42nd Pl and W. Auer Avenue, almost cause accidents while traveling northbound on Sherman Blvd, and ultimately crash into a tree at 4231 W. Capitol Dr. The pursuit was approximately 3.12 miles.

Officer McIntosh observed the driver of the Kia, who matched the description of the driver she observed initially, flee on foot from the Kia holding a black handle w/silver slide pistol in his right hand. Officer McIntosh gave multiple commands to the driver to stop and drop the firearm, in which the driver disregarded those commands. Officer McIntosh observed the driver went behind a gas station and briefly lost sight of the driver. Officer McIntosh found the driver running in an alley and into the yards onto N. Sherman Blvd. The driver was apprehended and was identified as defendant, Keasean Brown. Officer McIntosh located the firearm, a black handle w/silver slide Smith & Wesson 9mm located underneath a car where Officer McIntosh briefly lost sight of defendant. There was a front seat passenger of the Kia who fled from foot from officers and was identified as C.C. C.C. was also taken into custody and transported to St. Joseph's for medical treatment. C.C.'s injuries are unknown. The White Kia Sportage was reported stolen earlier that day by owner M.C.O. M.C.O. did not give anyone consent to take and drive her Kia or be a passenger inside the vehicle.
